Homework Projects

On the reverse of this letter you will find the next set of homework tasks for your child. Thank you and a huge well done to everyone who participated last term.

The school website has a link to support you. Please visit www.worksoppriory.org.uk and click on the HOMEWORK button on the front page. This will explain what we are doing and how you can be involved.

Children need to complete a minimum of three tasks in order to gain their initial reward and at least five to have the additional treat.

We would like children to bring in their project work on the week beginning 12th March so that we can have a Class Exhibition on Thursday 15th March from 2.30pm - 4pm. Children will be able to take their project work home again on Friday 16th March, with some special pieces chosen to go on display around the school.

It is really important that you get in touch with your class teacher if there is anything you would like explaining, if you want to check that the quality of the work is good enough, or if you or your child have any other concerns about the projects. Resources such as card, paper etc. are available free of charge from school. There will be opportunities on Wednesday 14th February and Wednesday 28th February for children to bring in any project pieces so that teachers can advise on any further work that might be needed. Children are also able to go to Homework/Project Club on Monday lunchtimes for further support.

We are sure that the children will be keen to impress and, whilst project work is neither compulsory nor competitive, we are hoping that once again we will see some very high quality pieces of work. So far, treats for doing great quality projects have included outdoor pizza making, visiting a climbing wall, watching Sheffield Steelers play ice hockey, enjoying a visit to an ice cream parlour and receiving gift vouchers to spend. It would be lovely to see even more of our children taking part this term!

Spring term homework project – Y3

- ✓ Design an item that could be used at a 'Rio Carnival'. This could be a piece of jewellery, a mask, or even a musical instrument (such as a drum or maracas).
- ✓ Create a poster for the Brazilian Tourist Board which will persuade people to visit Brazil. *(Posters are usually done on A4 or A3 paper. When you are ready to do your best copy, you are welcome to ask Mr Anderson for some paper) (Link to Knowledge Organiser)*
- ✓ Through research, find an animal which lives in the Amazon Rainforest. Create a report on this animal. (Link to Knowledge Organiser)
- ✓ Create a fruit kebab using different coloured fruit or research a traditional Brazilian dish to make. *(Bring it in on Exhibition Day or take some photos of the finished product)*
- ✓ Research a famous sportsman who is from Brazil. They could be/have been a professional footballer, volleyball player or other sportsman. Create a fact file which will highlight their achievements in their sporting area. (Link to Knowledge Organiser)
- ✓ Use some of the vocabulary on the Knowledge Organiser in a diary extract to describe a day's journey through the rainforest. (Link to Knowledge Organiser)

Please ask Mr Anderson if you have any questions or need any resources from school.

We expect all children to take pride in their work and good presentation is therefore essential. Work should be neatly and carefully completed. Best handwriting and positive attitudes please! Written work will usually be completed in pencil but can be enhanced through the use of illustrations, borders, ICT or collage.
