



1. Design and create either an Anglo Saxon helmet or a piece of Anglo-Saxon jewellery
2. Create a Powerpoint, fact file or video on one of the Anglo-Saxon kings such as King Alfred the Great or King Ethelred the Unready. *(Linked to KO)*

3. As an Anglo-Saxon king, create 3 new laws (and the punishments breaking each would bring!) *(Linked to KO)*

4. Using 10 of your spelling words, write a tale inspired by Beowulf, to be told around the fire.

This links to number 85 on the 100 list. Tell a story to a group of younger children Practice reading fluently and with expression, ready for your audience. Easy? Not quite! You need to write and illustrate a suitable short story first! When you are ready, tell your teacher and they will arrange a time for you to read to the younger children.

5. On a map of the UK plot where Anglo Saxon tribes settled and label the Anglo Saxon names for these areas *(Linked to KO)*

6. Research Anglo-Saxon superstitions and create a lucky charm to defend you from evil. *(Linked to KO)* Write a short explanation about which evil your lucky charm will protect you from and how it will protect you. Your research should inform this.
